

Why is noise a problem?


- Poor communication
- Entertainment enjoyment of sound
- Stress
- Strained relationships
- Difficulty at work
- Irritability
- Annoyance
- Fatigue



•Hearing Loss




What does noise do to hearing?



Health Effects

- Loud sounds destroy "hair cells" in inner ear ٠
 - Tiny sensory cells respond to sound waves •





Before Noise

After Noise

How much noise is too much?

• Regular exposure to average noise levels above

• <u>85 decibels</u>

- Can pose a risk to hearing
- How loud is 85 decibels?
 - Tinnitus rule
 - Arm's length rule





What does OSHA say about noise?


- Exposure above 85 dB requires hearing conservation program
 - Noise measurement
 - Training
 - Hearing Testing
 - Hearing Protection
 - Recordkeeping






How can I keep myself and my people safe?

- Reduce noise levels
 - Simple controls
- Administrative control
 - Move people
 - Manage time
- Personal protective equipment
 - Earplugs
 - Earmuffs
 - Caution may not provide the protection on the label



Which Hearing Protector is Best?

- Select protectors that:
 - Are comfortable
 - Fit your ears well
 - Work with your clothes, equipment, and other PPE
 - Easy to put on and take off








